



A translation grid for qualifications across countries








#### What NOT?

## Qualifications databases/registers



#### Establishing qualifications databases

- Important progress
- Available in most countries. A mix between
  - Pre-NQF databases, sometimes focussing on programmes rather than qualifications
  - Databases reflecting the NQFs
- A few countries still at planning stage
- The number of qualifications covered is increasing few empty registers left → from sector to comprehensive



#### NQF/EQF levels in qualifications databases

- •A growing group of countries where NQF <u>and</u> EQF levels are included in the register in a visible way BE (fr), CZ, EE, FR, DE, LV, LT, NL, SI, PT, RO, UK
- •A group where **only NQF levels** (or simply 'Levels') are indicated (AT, BE (fl), EL, IE, PL, SK)
- •In a few countries, databases **do not contain references** to EQF/NQF levels, qualifications documents themselves however do





## Databases – moving from the back office to the front office....

- Focussing on databases means to focus on the front-office functions of NQFs/EQF
- The comprehensive character of the EQF/NQFs needs to be reflected by the databases
- Databases should provide an **easily accessible map** showing what is the *content/profile and level* of a qualification and how it can be *linked to and combined with* other qualifications.
- Databases have evolved over time and build on different principles; can they move in the same direction and according to similar objectives in the years to come?



#### Learning outcomes in existing databases

- Existing databases increasingly contain information on learning outcomes
- Existing approaches vary in length, focus and structure and make understanding and comparison difficult
- Common presentation format (beyond Annex VI)?






## State of play of interconnection at EU level

## The qualifications dataset register (QDR)

https://ec.europa.eu/esco/qdr

- Service to republish qualifications in EU portals
- Supports various ways of publication (upload, hosted on your server manual/automatic update)
- Supports two schemata of qualification data:
  - QMS (qualification metadata schema) → Linked Open Data
  - EQF schema (legacy format for LOQ)
- Users: Member States and other owners of qualifications

#### Welcome to Qualification Dataset Register

The Qualification Dataset Register serves as a central qualifications data portal. It enables different governmental institutions and awarding bodies to publish information on their qualifications.

What do you need to do to submit your data?

- 1. Create an EU login (ECAS) account
- 2. Contact Administrators of Qualification Dataset Register to grant you EU login (ECAS) rights
- 3. Create a profile for your organisation
- 4. Submit your dataset, selecting the metadata and publishing options which apply for you


