

Since 2005*:



The website has been **visited** more than **126 million** times

• Record traffic in January 2019: 2,768,006 visits (+8% compared to January 2018)



Over 93 million document templates have been downloaded



More than 60 million Europass CVs have been created online

Record traffic in January 2019: 2,444,365 CVs created online (+17% compared to January 2018)





Comply with data protection legislation




Serve as a rich source of data and skills intelligence

- Prepare, submit and keep track of learning and job applications.


Information on skills and qualifications that could be relevant to the particular needs of third country nationals arriving or residing in the Union to support their integration

Interoperability mechanism





Be free-of-charge, without commercial purposes



Comply with data protection legislation



Ensure that the ownership of data lies with end-users

It consists of collaboration services which will allow for the exchange of data on:

- Learning opportunities;
- Job opportunities from EURES; and
- Qualifications, skills and experience of individuals.



Interoperability mechanism



- Provide streamlined exchange of data amongst different actors;
- Increase cooperation amongst different actors; and
- Enhance services offered to end-users.

- Involve stakeholders **from all relevant sectors**, and promote cooperation among public and private stakeholders in the activities under their responsibility.




Europass main actors National Europass Centres
